Rogier van der Wal Ph.D. is professor on “Moral Aspects of Work” at the Fontys University of Applied Sciences in Eindhoven, the Netherlands.

His research topics are ethical leadership, practical wisdom and new moral terminology, the connection between knowledge and strategy, and moral education. Rogier wrote his dissertation on an ethical treatise of the famous Roman statesman, advocate, and philosopher Marcus Tullius Cicero (106-43 BCE).

Besides, he is a fellow of the Thorbecke chair on Local Law & Governance at Leiden University in the Department of Law. He completed Master studies in Classics, Philosophy, and Public Administration at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam.
